

## SHOULD/SHOULDN'T

- **Should** significa dovrei, dovresti, ecc
- **Should** è seguito dall'infinito senza il 'to' (should do, should study, ecc)
- Si usa **should** per dare o richiedere consigli o pareri
  - You **should go** to bed early (dovresti andare a letto presto)
  - It's a really good film. You **should see** it (E' veramente un buon film.  
Dovresti vederlo)
- **Shouldn't** = **Should not** (non dovrei, non dovresti, non dovrebbe, ecc)
  - You **shouldn't go** to bed so late. (non dovresti andare a letto così tardi)
  - You **shouldn't work** too much. (non dovresti lavorare troppo)
